## The First Decade (2002-03 to 2011-12) of 'Professor H. S. Srivastava Foundation for Science and Society;' A slow and steady growth (<u>www.phssfoundation.org</u>)

Professor H. S. Srivastava Foundation for Science and Society (PHSSFSS), registered in Lucknow on 27th Feb 2002, under society registration act, 1960. The Foundation adopted the responsibility of publication of International Research Journal 'Physiology and Molecular Biology of Plants (PMBP; www.springer.com/journal/12298) which was started by late Professor H. S. Srivastava, then Professor in Department of Plant Science, MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, UP as Editor-in-Chief. Dr. Rana Pratap Singh, one of his Ph.D. students, then working as Lecturer in Biosciences M.D. University, Rohtak, Haryana was assigned the work as Executive Editor of PMBP from its first issue. This International Journal was started in 1995 by Research Periodicals and Book Service, INC, Houston, Texas, USA and after withdrawal of the publisher the journal was continued by The Society of Green World (SGW) Bareilly from 1996. After the untimely sad demise of Professor Hari Shankar Srivastava, a Foundation (PHSS) was established in Lucknow in his memory by the members of the SGW, which was dissolved thereafter. The Foundation named after him has a vision to communicate the concept, methodologies and outcomes of science and technology to young and rural masses and to focus on research and technology adoption in the field of sustainable agriculture and environmental restoration, the fields of his expertise. It is focused to disseminate the emerging knowledge and technologies useful for the sustainable and holistic development of our society in harmony with the human and the mother nature, through which we can transform the minds and skill of people for a more scientific and holistic life style. We think that the science as a concept, as a methodology, as technology and as a solution to our emerging problems should get a wider dissemination in the society and we should work for the people's participation in improvement of their happiness through the Sustainable Development at a large scale. To achieve this goal, a strong input for the evolution of contents, methodologies, tools, and programs for science communication and translational research, in the contemporary socio-economic, ecological, and cultural context is necessary.

The Journal PMBP started as a biannual international journal of plant functional biology, could achieve a strong global coverage in a short duration, despite of the technological limitations of that time. From very first issue the Journal PMBP started publishing research papers contributed by the researchers of various countries, which were peer reviewed and edited by an international editorial board of reputed scientists across the world e.g., India, Canada, Spain, Italy, South Korea, USA, Germany, Japan, Brazil, Ireland, Taiwan, U.K, Belgium, and Singapore etc.

Research periodicals and book services INC, Houston, Texas, USA supported the publication of the journal only up to Volume-1 numbers-1-2 (January and July, 1995) and there after the Society of Green World, Bareilly, India became the owner and sole publisher of this journal.

Late Professor H. S. Srivastava suffered with a sudden brain hemorrhage on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2001 in age of 55 year only, and we all socked with this sad news as his novel soul left the material world so early. In the given unfortunate situations, the Society of Green World, Bareilly, passed a resolution to establish another society in memory of Late Professor H. S. Srivastava in Lucknow (UP) and to close the existing Society of Green World, Bareilly, with its existing activities including the publication of the journal PMBP. Consequently, this new society (PHSS Foundation for Science

and Society, Lucknow) registered in Lucknow, accepted the challenge of the publication of PMBP with its past glory and its editorial office sifted to Rohtak in leadership of Dr. Rana Pratap Singh as the next Editor-in-Chief of the journal. He led the publication of this journal in the sole ownership of Professor H. S. Srivastava Foundation for Science and Society, Lucknow.

The newly registered society, PHSSFSS, has a Vision of the Application of Science for Sustainable Development, Peace and Prosperity and a Mission of Promoting Scientific Knowledge, Scientific Aptitude, Scientific Philosophies, its Methodologies, Technologies and Innovations for Sustainable Socio-economic and Cultural Development for Peace, Prosperity, and Poverty elimination from the contemporary human societies.

#### Aims and Objectives of the Foundation

The following specific objectives were formulated to fulfil the vision and mission of the Foundation:

1) Science communication through research journals, magazines, books, booklets, pamphlets in print and online version etc and mass communication through films, video, audio and video clips, folk arts, drama, and other art and literary forms.

2) To promote scientific knowledge aptitude and scientific temper in the experts and society at large through seminars, training, group discussions, popular lectures, posters, essay competitions, slide shows, field excursions and other promotional activities.

3) To promote transfer of technology, capacity building for establishment of small-scale entrepreneurship, sustainable agricultural practices and improvement in livelihoods by skill development, cultural and socioeconomic upliftment.

4) To confer the recognition and awards to professional groups and individuals for and scientific and ecological development, attainment of excellence in the field of science, agriculture, health, environmental restoration, science communication, innovative technologies, skill development, cultural development, social works and women empowerment etc.

5) To establish and manage the urban and rural research centres for the regeneration of environmentally, socially, and culturally degraded regions through research and innovations.

6) To promote and undertake the basic and translational Research and extension services in the field of Sustainable Agriculture, Ecosystem Restoration, Resource Conservation, Renewable Energy, and Development of the Innovative and Cost-effective Technologies.

7) To bring together individuals and organizations involved in the activities for the development of the Scientific Temper, Science Education, Scientific Research, and Popularization of scientific awareness for the Sustainable Socioeconomic, Cultural, and Ecological Developments based on the people's participation.

8) To promote the cause of conservation of nature and natural resources with emphasis on understanding and designing of novel and man-made ecosystems, natural history and socio-cultural aspects of the biosphere, natural resources, and the human society in relation to the human,

environment, and nature.

#### Activities done during this period

The Foundation started Professor H. S. Srivastava memorial lectures in Lucknow University, Lucknow on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2003, 2004 and 2005 to mark with the memory of late Professor Srivastava. The first PHSS memorial lecture was delivered by Professor S. B. Singh, the then Vice Chancellor, Lucknow University Lucknow on 'Science and Society.' The second PHSS Memorial lecture was delivered by Professor M. Yunus, then Head, Department of Environmental Science, Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow on 'Ozone depletion and its solution' on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2004 followed by a third lectured delivered by Professor U. N. Dwivedi, then Head Department of Biochemistry on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2005. He presented and discussed the significance of his research finding on Biochemistry and Molecular Biology of *Leucaena* which is a valuable tree due to its wood, used to make good quality charcoal, small furniture, and paper pulp etc.

After the sudden demise of late Professor H. S. Srivastava in 2002, the two consequent issues of PMBP i.e., Vol-8 (1 and 2) were dedicated to his memory in which invited articles in the area of his research i.e., 'Nitrogen Metabolism in Plants' were published. These articles were contributed by the leading experts in this research field located in USA, Brazil, Germany, Japan, Mexico, Cuba, Canada, Portugal, and India etc. They contributed their novel research outcome to honor the research contribution of Professor H. S. Srivastava on invitation by the Editor-in-Chief, PMBP.

The journal continued its journey as biannual from volume 8(1-2) to volume 11 (1-2) up to 2005 and from volume 12(1-4) to volume 19 (1), as quarterly with increased contribution from the global scientific communities of plant functional biology. A special issue on 'Trends in Photosynthetic Research' PMBP vol-11(2), 2005 was dedicated to Professor Randhir Singh, Former Head, Department of Biochemistry, Chaudhary Charan Singh Agriculture University Hisar, India, who was superannuating from his active service to honor his significant contributions in C-4 photosynthesis and ureide metabolism in plants. Professor B. C Tripathi of Jawahar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi was guest editor of this very distinct issues of PMBP.

Year 2005 was a mile stone, in the history of this journal when Dr. Nandula Raghuram from Guru Govind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi joined the Editorial team as another key team member and was designated as Executive Editor. From 2006 it was decided to publish this journal as a quarterly journal rather than a biannual journal.

All the four issues of PMBP were published timely in 2006-07 with participation of international community of plant scientists as authors, reviewers, and editors. Year 2008 was another major milestone in the growth of PMBP, when an agreement was signed by PHSS Foundation for Science and Society, Lucknow with Springer. The Springer became a co-publisher and sole distributer of PMBP from 2008. The involvement of a global commercial partner, Springer, the global visibility of PMBP was increased tremendously with new authorship and readership with enhanced novelty in the contents published in the journal. The Foundation was also benefited economically with this collaboration as a royalty was started for PMBP by springer through its increasing sale year by year.

In addition to the publication of the journal PMBP, the foundation initiated three PHSS Foundation Awards in 2012-13. These awards were named as follows-

- 1. Prof. H S Srivastava Life Time Achievement Award- Rs. 25,000/=, Medal and Citation.
- 2. Prof. H S Srivastava Award for Social Contribution- Rs. 15,000/=, Medal, Citation.

चीनी के उपभोग से डाइवेटिज, किंडनी, मोटापा, हृदय एवं लीवर रोग तथा दाँतों का सड़ना बढ़ जाता है। स्टीभिया एवं मुलेहठी के चीनी के प्रयोग से भोजन, चाय तथा पेय पदार्थ मीठे लगते है और किसी तरह का रोग नही होता।

जापान, चाइना, अमेरिका, आस्ट्रेलिया, यूरोप एवं अन्य विकसित देश स्टीभिया तथा मुलेहठी के चीनी का प्रयोग कर रहे हैं। फलतः उनके यहाँ अनेक तरह की बीमारिया घट रही हैं। इसके विपरीत भारत में उपरोक्त रोग बढ़ रहे है। आज भारत 3.5 करोड़ डाइवेटिज ग्रसित रोगियों के साथ विश्व में प्रथम स्थान पर हैं।

रोजगार में वृद्धिः स्टीभिया तथा मुलेहठी से चीनी बनाने के लिए छोटे संयंत्र उपलद्ध है जो कम पैसे में गाँवो / कस्बों में स्थापित किये जा सकते है। इससे गाँवो में रोजगार तथा नौकरी के साधन एवं अवसर बढ़ जाएगे।

## International Conference on "Advances in Sustainable Agriculture: Bioresources, Biotechnology and Bioeconomy"

An International Conference on "Advances in Sustainable Agriculture Bioresources, Biotechnology and Bioeconomy" was organised on November 29 and 30, 2019 at Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. The International Conference was jointly organized by the Mansarovar Global University, Bhopal and the PHSS Foundation for Science & Society, Lucknow.



The inaugural function was presided over by the Chief Guest, Dr Manju Sharma, NASI-DST Women Distinguished Scientist Chair and former Secretary, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. Mr. Gaurav Tiwari, Pro-Chancellor of Mansarovar Global University welcomed the dignitaries and participants. In his welcome address he said that the Indian scientific community has great responsibility in ensuring the food and nutritional security of the country and at the same time contributing to the welfare of the farming community. Poverty and hunger need to be alleviated at war footing. Welcoming the delegates, Professor Arun Kumar Pandey, Vice-Chancellor, Mansarovar Global University, emphasized that India has robust farming communities and traditions, but they need technological inputs for higher crop yield, control of pests and pathogens, post-harvest storage, transportation and marketing. Molecular and biotechnological tools should also be pressed into service for achieving crop yields comparable to developed countries. Wise use of water and reduced dependence on pesticides are also important for sustainable agriculture.



Dr Manju Sharma delivered the inaugural address and acceptance speech for Lifetime Achievement Award. She said that for Indian Agriculture to be sustainable we need to take care of soil, water, biodiversity and quality of human life. She threw light on the recent trends in agriculture and emphasised that there is a need for enriching the rural economy and enhance farmer's income. The problem of hunger and malnutrition should be solved through crop diversification, improved varieties and environment-friendly methods of cultivation. Farmers deserve help in profitable marketing of their produce. Dr Sharma also stated that greater involvement of women in science is essential, as women are more sensitive to environmental and human needs.

Invited lectures were delivered by Prof. Marcio J. Pocas-Fonseca (University of Brasilia, Brazil), Prof. N. Raghuram (GGS Indraprashtha University, New Delhi), Dr R.D. Tripathi (CSIR-National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow), Prof. Naveen Kumar Arora (Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow), Prof. Renu Deswal (University of Delhi), Prof. S.M. Paul Khurana (Amity University, Haryana), Dr M.K. Tripathi (ICAR- CIAE, Bhopal), Dr Girish Mishra (University of Delhi), Prof. V.N. Pandey (DDU Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur), Prof. C. Rajasekaran (Vellore Institute of Technology, Vellore).

PHSS Foundation Award lectures were delivered by Prof. R.C. Chaudhary (PRDF, Gorakhpur) and Dr Purabi Saikia (Central University of Jharkhand, Ranchi). Dr Ulrich Berk from Germany presented scientific evidence on how homo organic farming (Agnihotra') helped in improving air quality and in enhancing crop yields through improved soil quality and optimal water use. The major thematic areas covered during the conference were: 1. Bioresources and Biodiversity, 2. Plant Tissue Culture and Transgenic Technology, 3. Plants and Biotic stresses/ Plant-Microbe Interactions, 4. Plant Genetics and Breeding, 5. Agro-product processing and entrepreneurship and 6. Impact of Climate Change on Agriculture.



A Young Scientist Conclave was organised on the second day of the conference. Dr P.K. Singh (CSIR-National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow) delivered lead lecture and highlighted the work being done on developing cotton varieties resistant to white fly that cause viral diseases. His lecture was followed by presentations of the young scientists on molecular and biotechnological aspects of crop improvement which have the potential to revolutionize agriculture in India. Besides oral presentations, poster session was also organised. Many of the presentations generated lively discussions.

A total of 130 delegates from across the country and abroad participated. The conference provided an opportunity to the participants to exchange their views and share their ideas for promoting sustainable use of bio resources, use of biotechnology in crop improvement and bio economy. This Conference was sponsored by the National Academy of Sciences, India and NASI (Bhopal Chapter). The certificate to the winners of young scientist award were distributed by the dignitaries on the dais.
